In my parents' home church they sing the Lord's Prayer each Sunday to a tune I've only heard at one other church. It was in Pennsylvania, back when I was in college, a long time ago. Years later I remember visiting Montana with my husband when he was at a conference. Another spouse and I visited a local church where we sang a complicated hymn, "The heavens are telling the glory of God." I located the hymn in an old hymnal and enjoyed teaching myself that melody to the words from Psalm 19.

At a family reunion in Pennsylvania a few years ago we worshiped at an AME church and sang, "When we all get to heaven, what a day of rejoicing that will be. When we all see Jesus, we'll sing and shout the victory." It's a tune that stays in your head. I also remember a family reunion in Virginia when I was little. We went to Free Union Baptist Church where the service began at 11:00 am. Then we broke for a luncheon feast that the church supplied, followed by more church. It's a happy memory. We only went there once, though. My mother said it lasted too long.

More recently, when my husband and I spent weekends out on the end of Long Island, I would go to the Whalers' Church in Sag Harbor. The pews all have doors on the ends that you have to open in order to go in and sit down. Members there got to know me, and I them. Once at a coffee hour I wondered aloud if the slice of cake I was being served was made from scratch. The lady standing beside me assured me that it was, she had opened the box of cake mix herself!

Most often when I am unable to attend Great Kills Moravian on Sunday morning, I participate on Zoom. I'm grateful for the convenience of turning on my iPad and finding my community. During the pandemic, Jim and Tracy delivered communion supplies to my house. Riddick Weber sent me a copy of a sermon that I asked for. Sometimes, though, I miss visiting a different church and finding something new. This summer while you're on vacation, whether you visit local churches, or if you connect to Great Kills via Zoom, please remember that the financial needs of Great Kills Moravian Church continue whether we are here or not. A MESSAGE FROM THE EASTERN DISTRICT BOARD:

As your congregation enters this period of pastoral transition, we offer this information explaining the process of call for the Moravian Church, Eastern District.

The Moravian call system is neither appointive (the pastor is not assigned by the denomination) nor congregational (that is, elected by the vote of the congregation). Ours is a <u>conferential</u> system in which denominational officials and the local Joint Board confer in order to find the pastor that will meet the needs of the congregation. We believe the leading of the Holy Spirit is clearly part of our call process. Steps in the process are:

- 1. The District Board is responsible for initiating the call process. Its representatives meet with the Joint Board to help identify the needs of this parish. Through congregational assessment, the District Board will carefully match the needs of this church with the strengths of the ordained women and men who might be available for call. The Joint Board can also suggest names, which the District Board will then review to discern their appropriateness and availability.
- 2. The next step is for the District President to meet again with the Joint Board in order to present biographical and evaluative material on the recommended clergy decided upon in Step 1.
- 3. Following in-depth discussion, a secret ballot will be cast. When two thirds of the total board membership agrees on a potential pastor, and after working out the terms of the call (such as salary, housing, travel expense, continuing education, etc.), the District President issues the call to the pastor in the name of the Moravian Church, Northern Province. Please note that the Joint Board serves as the personnel committee; the congregation does not vote to call a pastor. It must be noted that the Joint Board and the District Board will keep the choice secret so that the pastor is free of external pressures in seeking the Lord's direction. Members of the congregation must respect the need for secrecy by not pressuring the Joint Board for advance information.

4. Unless the called pastor feels no leading by God to the congregation, a ministry dialogue will take place with the calling Joint Board and the called Pastor. A member of the EDEB will be present.

- 5. Following the ministry dialogue meeting, the Joint Board will vote to reconfirm (or not) the original call to the Pastor. This also requires a 2/3 vote of the total membership of the Joint Board. The Pastor will be notified of the Joint Board action.
- 6. Should the call be reaffirmed, a written reply to the call is requested by the District President and the Joint Board will be notified of the response. If the call is accepted, that will be announced to the congregation. If it is declined, the District President and the Joint Board will meet again to pursue the process further, returning to step #2. Long experience with the call system indicates:
- 1. That it is democratic in nature.
- 2. That democracy can move slowly sometimes.
- 3. That the local church benefits from the help which the denomination can give and a real partnership can develop.
- 4. Responsibility and choice are shared by the local church, the denomination, and the pastor.
- 5. That if the pastor who is called declines the call, it does not imply a negative judgment on the congregation but, rather, a sense of no clear leading of the Lord to accept.
- 6. That the leading of the Holy Spirit has repeatedly been demonstrated to be active in the call process.

Festival Days: John Hus Festival and August 13 Festival are two days of celebration unique to the Moravian Church. John Hus, considered one of the first Moravian theologians was martyred for his faith, burned at the stake, in 1415. Grace Moravian Church in Queens will hold the local John Hus Festival on July 6 at 3:30.

August 13 is considered the "Spiritual Birthday" of the Moravian Church. On that day in 1727, members of the Herrnhut community experienced a profound outpouring of love during worship. Count Zinzendorf sent them food from his manor house. Food offerings in worship became lovefeasts.
