

Great Kills Moravian Church Scrapbooks:

Through the generosity of an anonymous donor we were recently able to digitize a series of fifteen scrapbooks that chronicle the history and activities of Great Kills Moravian Church. This congregation, which started in 1886 still serves the community today.

Twelve of these scrapbooks are organized according to pastorate, running from 1886 through 2015, with each volume including a wide range of material such as newsletter, the minutes of church council meetings, photographs, the newspaper clippings. The other three are focused on specific events, the congregation's 75th and 100th anniversary celebrations and a nursery school.

This material presents a fascinating look at this congregation's history, through both major developments and day-to-day activities. It is a valuable resource for anyone interested in the congregation, Staten Island, 20th century culture, and many other topics as well.

We are excited to have the opportunity to make this material accessible to researchers by digitizing them and making them available online.
