November 1 is All Saints Day.

We Protestants do not canonize saints. Nor do we venerate them. They are not part of our worship services. We don't learn about them in Sunday School. Yet there are some historical saints we recognize. Saint Francis of Assisi is associated with the beautiful prayer—"Lord make me an instrument of thy peace" that we sang as a hymn last month at the memorial service for our sister, Madeline Muller. The Church of Saint Clare around the corner is named in honor and memory of Saint Clare of Assisi, contemporary of Saint Francis, who founded the Poor Clares. Every year we hold Ecumenical Thanksgiving services with Saint Clare's as well as Christ Lutheran Church. Saint Stephen's Episcopal Church in Tottenville is named after Stephen, the first Christian martyr. Saul, a prominent Pharisee, condoned and witnessed Stephen's murder. Shortly afterward, Jesus confronted him on the road to Damascus. Saul became known as Paul—Saint Paul, the missionary— whose letters are part of the New Testament.

All Saints Day is really about unnamed saints, our ancestors and contemporaries in Christian faith, about whom Jesus said, "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you visited me." Saints are the great cloud of witnesses described in Hebrews 12:1. They are the great multitude clothed in white described in Revelation 7.

The Watchword for All Saints Day, according to the *Daily Texts, is Revelation 7:10.*"Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne and to the Lamb."
