Three weeks ago, our sanctuary was decorated for Christmas with crèche, lighted Christmas trees, and an Advent Wreath. Later this month we'll observe Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, the six-week season that leads to Easter. In one calendar year, we try to remember and honor the three-year ministry of Jesus. We started the liturgical year in November with Advent leading up to Christmas. Then Epiphany followed on January 6. Next came the baptism of the Lord on January 11. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, leading six weeks later, to the crucifixion on Good Friday, and the resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday. Historically, Lent has been a season of penitence and reflection in preparation for Easter. The 40 days of Lent represent the 40 days Jesus was tempted in the wilderness after his baptism.

Yes, Moravians acknowledge Ash Wednesday. Yes, Moravians can receive ashes. Traditionally, the ashes used to make the sign of the cross on foreheads, come from the ashes of palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday service. Different Christian denominations have additional customs. Some encourage fasting on Ash Wednesday and throughout Lent. Some encourage members to "give up something for Lent." Interestingly, if you give up something for Lent, you give it up Monday through Saturday for six weeks. On Sunday, you can eat the chocolate, play the video game, or do whatever it is you gave up for Lent because Sunday is a little Easter. Traditionally in Roman Catholic areas, the day before Ash Wednesday is called Fat Tuesday or *Mardi Gras* in French. Some people eat pancakes on Fat Tuesday to use up all the butter in the house, because starting on Ash Wednesday, their households will fast from butter.

While some Protestants object to Ash Wednesday considering it a Roman Catholic ritual, others find that rituals lead to spiritual growth. On that note, we are invited to share Ash Wednesday services with New Dorp Moravian Church on February 18 at 7:00pm.
